

Robert Hopkins School Council Record of Discussion – January 10, 2019

- **1. WELCOME**
- 2. SCHOOL UPDATE

a) Principal report

- Thank you for Council support to families in need.
- **Report Cards:** To be sent home February 14. Explained achievement chart and criterion-based assessment, where Level 3 (of 4) is where a student is meeting expectations. Discussion focused on how teachers encourage kids to go beyond by building the criteria for success together with them.
 - For more information: <u>Growing Success</u>, Ministry of Education, 2010 and <u>Kindergarten</u> <u>addendum</u>.
- Sledding/Tobogganing: Letter sent home with students outlining School's approach. The school has small hills with no obstructions. Sledding is currently not possible (due to how the snow is ploughed) but should weather/snow situation permit, the school will allow students to sled down the hills during recess in a designated area under school supervision. Families may choose that their children do not take part by returning the letter that was sent home. Families may also send a helmet for their children to wear.
 - <u>Ophea</u>, which manages Ontario Physical Education Safety Guidelines, recommends that children wear helmets when sledding or tobogganing.
- Wellness plan: Three areas of focus: student voice, resilience and community-building initiatives. To help build community within the school, the school is undertaking a "2x10 initiative" targeting students at risk or students who need extra support from an adult. For 10 days, adults in the school (another teacher, school custodian, etc.) will seek out a specific student to have 2-minute conversations with them. The children are not aware of the initiative; the conversations are student-led and natural. Teachers are identifying students who could benefit from the initiative.

b) Teacher update

- **Yoga:** Begins Tuesday January 15 for Grades 1-5 students. There will be 3 sessions per week for 8 weeks. Interested students will participate in one session per week. 157 students have signed up to participate in the program; 6 teachers volunteering to supervise.
- **Choir:** Grades 3-5 choir will sing the national anthem acapella at the February 15 Ottawa 67s game. Members will be bringing home participation forms. Families will be responsible for transportation. Choir members will be able to watch the hockey game for no cost and must be accompanied by an adult, who can purchase tickets for \$15 see Fundraising Committee Update in Annex 2 for more information on the Ottawa 67s game.
- **Galaxy intramurals:** Grades 3-5 will take part in this version of dodgeball, to help develop teamwork and targeting skills.
- Kindergarten information night: Wednesday January 30 at 6pm.
- **Tennis workshop:** All students to participate on February 4 and 6.



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- **Basketball:** Interested Grades 4-5 to participate in this interschool activity beginning in February with a tournament March 6.
- WE Day: 14 Grade 5 students to be selected to travel to Montreal by bus on February 11 to participate in WE Day at the Theatre Saint Denis. <u>WE Day</u> celebrates students making a difference through charitable activities that benefit the local and global community. Application for Grade 5 students were sent home on January 10.
- **Carnaval d'Hiver:** Being organised by the French immersion teachers in February (date TBC) (like the Carnaval in Quebec City).

3. How to Support our Child's Math Instruction: Presentation by Ms. Lyndsay Keyes (Grade 1 and 2/3 EFI English/Math)

- Ms. Keyes provided a very interesting presentation, which was followed by a very engaged discussion, on a new approach being taught in math classes.
- "Number Talks" are a specific way of teaching and reinforcing mental math strategies in a group setting. Teachers in all grades are doing "Numbers Talks" for a few minutes daily.
- Teachers are also doing "Number Talk Check-ins", a written exercise each child completes
 individually, every three weeks to help confirm whether students are really understanding the
 different mental math strategies discussed and how to apply them to different math problems.
- School has found this approach to be very beneficial. It allows students to answer questions at their own pace and promotes opportunities for students to learn from each other. The approach encourages flexible thinking, and looking at a problem and its solution from multiple angles.
- Families were encouraged to support their children's math learning at home by asking mental math questions and exploring which strategy the children used to find the solution. Should your child not get the correct answer, families were encouraged to explain the approach they would use to find the solution.
- Discussion included helping families become more familiar with the concepts being taught and how they resemble the approaches that adults would have learned at school. Discussion also touched on the benefits of learning multiple strategies, as different strategies can be applied more effectively to certain problem and not others. Document shared: <u>Number Talk common language</u>.
