

1. WELCOME

2. SCHOOL UPDATE

a) Principal report

- **Staffing update:** School will receive staffing numbers based on enrollment in early April, and will begin the process of organizing how teachers will be assigned and how classes will be organized. There will likely be some changes for next year.
- <u>EQAO</u>: Volunteers are needed! School is seeking 15-20 volunteers for blocks of approximately 2 hours during the last week of May and first week of June to help oversee the provincial assessments of reading writing and math.
- Well-being: VoiceSquad continues to add their voice to student led initiatives. They are focusing on respect and kindness this month even when differences of opinion exist. Second group of VoiceSquad leaders will come together for April and May. They will be doing a "Dress Loud Day" initiative for deaf and hard of hearing awareness; more details to come!
- School Learning Plan: On April 17, the School will be hosting our Numeracy Coach and an Early Learning Coach around Fundamentals of Math and our Number Talks. We will be doing a lesson study in both a junior class and a primary/Kinder class. Teachers will plan, act, observe and reflect on the lesson. The School will work towards establishing a direction for moving forward for the next couple of years.
- <u>School Climate Survey</u>: From April 23-May 10, 2019, students in grades 4 and 5 will complete the OurSCHOOL School Climate Survey online at school. All School districts in Ontario are required to conduct school climate surveys with students at least every two years. Parents/guardians who do not want their child(ren) to complete the survey must advise the school in writing by returning the non-consent form by April 18, 2019.

b) Teacher update

- Herd Day (April 11): During the middle block, all kids broke into small groups containing students from every grade and created a contraption to help an egg survive a 3 metre fall. During the last block, the contraptions were put to the test during a whole school assembly. A group from the Brown Suisse herd took home the prize for the best invention!
- **Choir:** Grades 3, 4, 5 choir has been meeting once a week, preparing for **Choralfest** at Canterbury High School on **April 17**. At Choralfest, school choirs come together for a day of workshops, rehearsals and team-building, and all of the choirs joining together to perform as one for family and friends.
- **Kinder Science Workshops:** Doctor D will be visiting on April 17 to run 45 minute science workshops for each kindergarten class. Among the highlights, students will work with a clock powered by a banana and will create a battery circuit with a switch to power a light.
- **Bordenball:** Grades 3, 4, 5 students have been participating in intramurals since early April in preparation for a tournament on May 2.
