- Picnic tables are not coming this year. Possibly never. Todd Thompsom [former Principal] had suggested we use those funds.
- Silent Auction may be quite small this year
- My opinion is we can do this. Figures from Kim Belliveau, is $\sim \$ 9,000$. High shipping costs. Second shipment in April.
- I move that we cover all of books now. Knowing that, if there is movement on the picnic tables, we may go into the red this Council year, but will make it up next year.
- Celine Leduc, Principal: Noted
- Andy: Seconded.
- Margaret: I thought it would be $\$ 4,000$ this year and $\$ 4,000$ next. It will be over budget, and all this year.
- Andy: Any opposed?
- Tamara: Question: Have we not paid for the picnic tables?
- Louise: We have to ask the School Board for permission
- Tamara: So, nowhere close, so funds for tables are up for grabs
- Andy: Paying another $\$ 1,300$ for books
- Jancey Wallace: How much for shipping?
- Of voting members present, any opposed? All members present voted in favour. None opposed.
- Celine:

- Labour dispute
- We don't a lot of information.
- I haven't heard a lot of talk about it, which is good. Kids get the attention they deserve.
- Transfer period
- Zero capacity. Anyone who applies, even if they meet criteria, will be denied. Policy allows families to appeal. Board will look and make a decision. Principal has no say.
- Maria Blahoianu: If a new family moves in...
- Celine: OK if in our area.
- Louise: It hasn't happened before.
- Staffing
- Received projected numbers for next year. Louise and Celine will look at those and registrations of kindergarten, and try to ensure we are getting proper staffing so we don't have to restructure in the Fall. Only area where numbers seem low is JK. Too early.
- Transition:
- Plan for kinder yard. Will seek advice from kinder families to see what we can do differently or more creatively to ensure all spaces are used for play.
- Goal is to know all student names by March Break.
- Tamara: Question - During labour disputes, as a parent, are we able to send emails to teachers to ask how kids are doing, or asking about work, etc.?
- Celine:
- You absolutely can. The difficulty is when they can meet with you. Their time is more limited. You are within your rights and they can answer that. They can't say, "If I had a report card, this is what it would say."
- We can't have staff meetings, but we are still meeting about students.
- Mary Lebeau: You can talk to teachers. If you want marks, you can email the Principal.
- Celine: You have a right as a parent to know how your child is doing. That is ongoing, whether there is a labour dispute or not.
- Francine Peart: Can the school send something out re: what the strike is about?
- Andy: We as a Council made a decision not to be political; to stay neutral. I suggest checking the two union websites.
- Danielle: Is there a point at which school will go into the summer?
- Celine: The Education Act says a minimum number of days. That said, the government can change things. I have not heard anything formal.
- Brunella Buscicchio: Plans to recover lost lessons - more homework?
- Celine: Will speak to Superintendent.
- Tamara: Question about snow days. What are the requirements when the busses are cancelled - do you need X number of students before you can do classroom work?
- Celine: I've never heard of that. Snow days are different for each site. Here, not much different than a regular day. I can't guide staff as to what I would like snow days to be, as I don't have the opportunity right now.
- Mary: Can we assume no new work when kids can't get to school?
- Louise: Kids never have to catch up if they're not here on a snow day.

- Proposed adjustment to Budget: There are cost and logistical problems with splitting up the order of French readers over two years.
