- 3) Principal Update (Nathalie)
 - Recognize ongoing, unprecedented time
 - Grade 3/4 class now in portable
 - Sensory room running with protocols
 - Gym in use with protocols
 - Not using common areas (e.g., Library Commons)
 - School photos were scheduled for Feb 8; now delayed
 - Clothing drive: Rest of clothes to be donated to Carson Grove; some underwear/socks to be bought

- Hiring: Mme Roy Gr 2; Ms. Sheila Purple Team
- Staffing shortages beginning. May need to pivot to remote learning for a classroom. Will do best to advise night before.
- Also recognize will have many student absences. Educators will provide assessment and feedback on submitted work. No synchronous opportunities. No formal eval of asynchronous learning.
- Explanation of no synchronous learning on Monday
- Discussion of open windows at school Board says "generally" to keep them closed
 - Alanna: Worked last year
 - Stephanie: Her class is not too cold; never below 19 degrees
- Protocols
- Sarah: Grade 1 son saying can't leave classroom due to cold weather –
 is there a limit on gym use? Also not getting enough time to eat. Time
 restricted?
 - Nathalie: No change to nutrition. Just can't talk with mask off.
 Re: leaving the classroom students all have gym period.
- Kim: Evaluation vs. assessment for students at home?
 - Nathalie: Explains. No exceptions for individual students.
- Nathalie: rapid antigen tests ("RATs") came home today. Meant to be used when student or staff has symptoms. Take test. If negative, monitor symptoms and take another test 24 hrs later (48 if gastro). If 2nd test negative, come back to school. To further shorten 5-day isolation if symptoms improving or gone.
 - Jamie: Follow instructions on school screening form re: when to take tests.
 - Nathalie: We don't have more tests. Have asked Board for more for when rest of students return in person. School does still have some PCR tests (not replaceable).
 - Heather: Tests for families whose kids are at home?
 - Nathalie: Can come pick them up. Aren't short that many. If you didn't get any, let us know.
 - Mary: Have you received the 3-ply masks?
 - Nathalie: Yes. Small and medium. Three ply, goes over the nose, adjustable. We had them before Xmas. Parents, pls keep an eye on whether child's mask is



fitting. Got enough for one per student plus some extra.
