  - classes range from 17-27 students
  - More than 20 languages spoken at home
  - 44 ELL learners, 20 learners formally id'd as exceptional but many others unidentified/on IEPs.
  - 24 tier 2 student support groups running
  - 1 Admin, 24 teachers, 8 ECEs, 2.5 EAs, 1 library tech, 1 OA, 0.5 OAA,
     2.5 custodians
